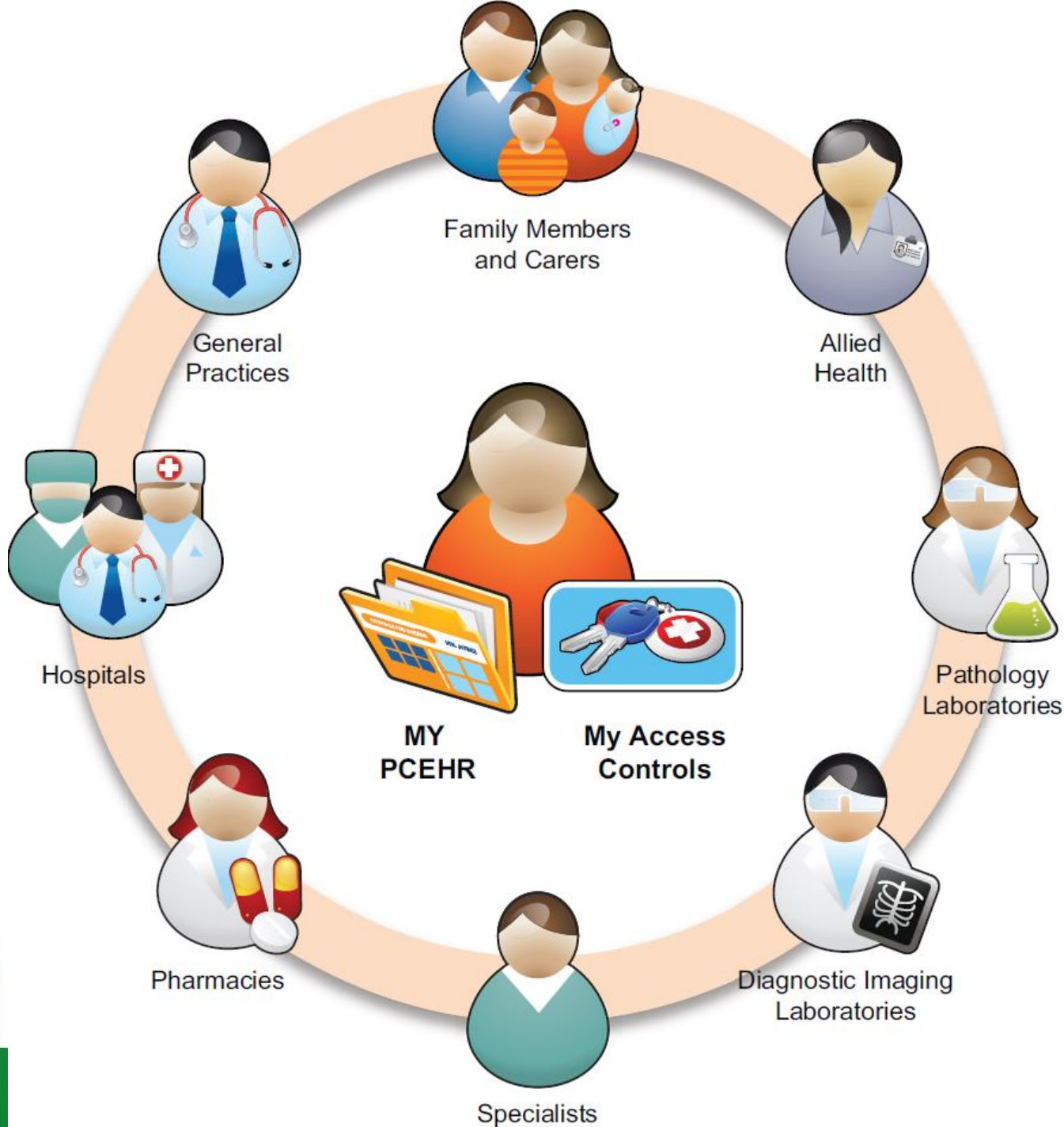

Why do we need a better connected system?

Each year the average Australian has around 22 interactions with the health system, including:

- ❖ **FOUR** visits to a GP
- ❖ 12 pharmacy prescriptions
- ❖ **THREE** visits to a medical specialist
- ❖ **TWO** visits to an allied health professional (e.g. physiotherapist)
- ❖ **ONE** visit to the dentist

What is in my eHealth record now?

- Personal details
- Organ donor status
- MBS, PBS & ACIR data
- Personal Health Summary – entered by you and viewable by providers
- Personal Health Notes – entered by you, but not viewable by providers
- Advanced Care Directive custodian
- Emergency Contact details

What will be in my eHealth record?

- Shared Health Summary – created by your GP
 - Allergies & Adverse Reactions
 - Immunisations
 - Current Medications
 - Medical History
- Event Summaries
- Discharge Summaries
- Prescription information
- Pathology and Imaging results
- Referrals and Reports
- Team Care Arrangements

What are the benefits of having an eHealth record?

- Keep track of your immunisations
- Access your key health information when you need it
- Provide access to the people that need it
- Control and change access when required
- Reduced duplication of tests
- You don't have to rely on your memory of dates and information
